The **Research Centre of Sri Aurobindo Yoga and Knowledge Foundation** organised an international conference on Sustainable Research, Innovation and Technology: Shaping the Future through Interconnected Knowledge at **Sharanam in Pondicherry**, an internationally acclaimed model for sustainable building and design. The conference was held on 13th September 2025 in an offline mode with 45 participants and continued online on 15th September 2025 with 25 participants. The proceedings were published under ISBN 978-81-990824-1-0. Supported by knowledge partners – **Aarupadai Veedu Medical College, Pondicherry with Vinayaka Mission; Dr. C.V. Raman University, Bilaspur, Chhattisgarh; and Shri Shankaracharya Institute of Professional Management & Technology, Raipur** – the event brought together academic leaders, innovators, and researchers to engage in meaningful dialogue on sustainability through interconnected knowledge systems.

The conference commenced with an offering at the lotus feet of The Mother and Sri Aurobindo, followed by a meditative opening that set a contemplative tone for the day. **Dr. Indrani Ghosh, Founder Trustee of the Sri Aurobindo Foundation**, inaugurated the conference by sharing the organisation's socio-spiritual motivation for linking sustainability research with conscious evolution. **Shubhangi, Co-Founder of Sustainable India**, introduced the initiatives of the organisation, including The Mirra – a wellness and sustainability platform launched in collaboration with the foundation.

Dr. Samarendra, Director of the foundation, elaborated on the foundation's ongoing projects and its role in fostering sustainability-centric education and research.

The keynote address was delivered by **Dr. Lucas, Founder of EcoPro**, who shared his journey connecting Sri Aurobindo's yoga with sustainable practices and described his work in agriculture, sanitation, and waste management. **Tom Lane from EcoFemme** presented an inspiring discussion on sustainable menstruation, focusing on reusable sanitary products and their socioeconomic impact on rural women in Tamil Nadu. Distinguished institutional leaders also addressed the audience: **Prof. Rajiv Prakash, Director of IIT Bhilai**, discussed the institute's vision for sustainable innovation and rural technology; **Dr. Rakesh Sehgal, Dean of AVMC Pondicherry**, motivated participants to engage in sustainable entrepreneurship; **Dr. Aravind Tiwari, Registrar of Dr. C.V. Raman University**, outlined the university's initiatives for rural empowerment through technology; and Dr. Anupam Tiwari highlighted sustainability-driven projects and community-focused research at the university.

The offline session concluded with an engaging discussion in which participants shared personal reflections on sustainability, followed by presentations of research papers showcasing new developments in sustainable research and innovation. The online session, held on 15th September under the chairmanship of **Prof. Kavita Holey, Head of IQAC Cell, Kavikulguru Kalidasa University, Ramtek**, featured 25 academic presenters. The Progress Global Awards were conferred upon two outstanding educationists and researchers in recognition of their contributions to sustainability and innovation.

All participants arrived in Pondicherry on 10th September and stayed until 14th September 2025, experiencing a three-day cultural and experiential tour alongside the conference.

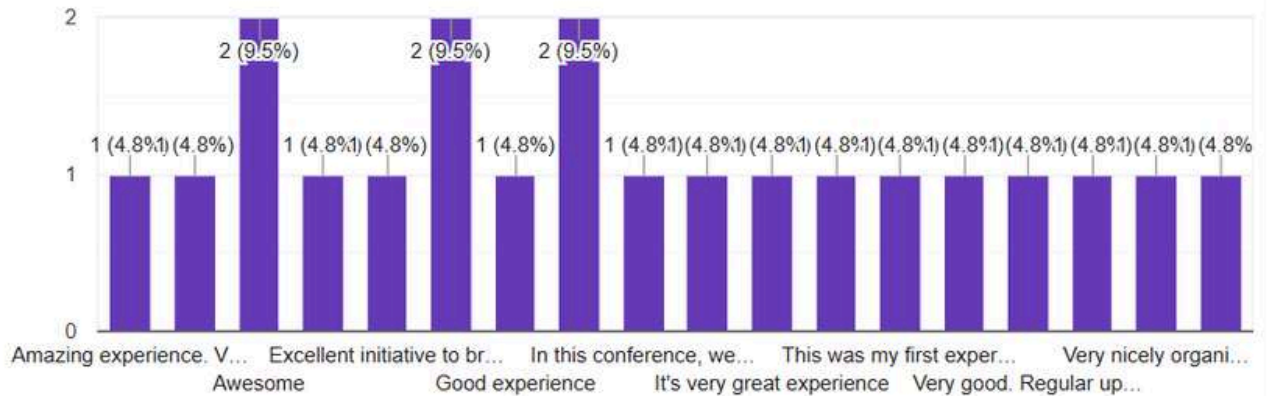

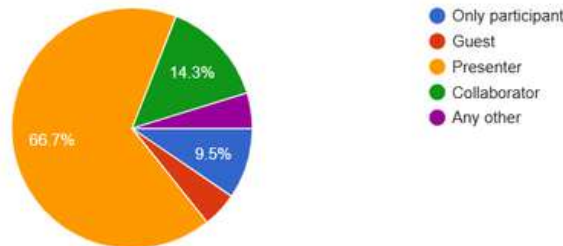

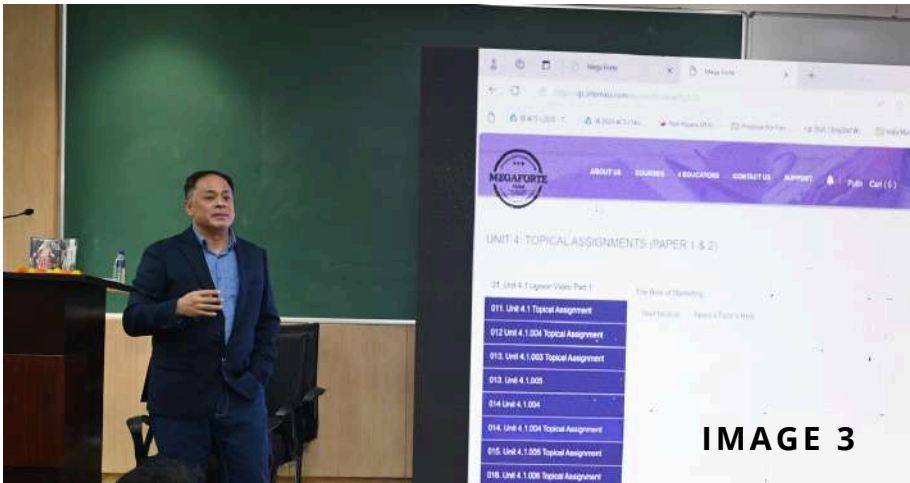

Some students who needed emergency care were identified and prescribed urgent medical attention by the Doctors. The parents were equally elated by the gesture of the initiative. Creative art and craft training facilities would enable women empowerment leading the women to support their families. This village comprised of Santhal women and language barrier was an issue for them. The school would benefit with more such events and awareness programs on health and hygiene would lead to proper shaping of their live and their growth.
